

## **Risk assessment and management template - Incursions**

Approved providers, nominated supervisors and family day care educators must ensure a risk assessment is carried out before having the outside community come into the service and on Woodlands premises. Prior authorisation must also be obtained from parents or other authorised nominees.

ACECQA has prepared this template to assist services in undertaking risk assessments before the wider community come into the service premises as part of an incursion, which services may wish to incorporate within their own risk assessment material.

For incursions, there is no dedicated regulation. Woodlands use snippets of the excursion regulation - Regulation 101 of the Education and Care Services National Regulations includes the minimum risk assessment considerations for excursions, including specific considerations when dealing with the broader community.

\*Incursions means: means when you have a person or company coming into a Campus that is not from the company or organisation. This can happen at any time that it suits the service, as they should be a part of the educational program.
